Code of Conduct

RMSB has implemented a Code of Conduct for the benefit of the players (our children). Our purpose is to create baseball opportunities for the youth in a comfortable and safe environment. All participants (**coaches, parents, players**) must understand their role in youth baseball. We deem it necessary to implement a Code of Conduct for RMSB Tournaments and Leagues. We ask for your cooperation and assistance in following this code. You will have the opportunity to AGREE to the Code of Conduct during online registration for each event. *Please share this information with your team.*

CODE OF CONDUCT

Participants (Coaches, Parents, Players) WILL

- Learn the RMSB rules and follow them.
- Be respectful (includes teammates, opposing players, coaches, umpires, spectators, and property).
- Never place the value of winning above the value of instilling the highest ideals of character.
- Respect the decisions of the umpires.
- Remember who the game is for.
- Help ensure that the game environment is free of drugs, tobacco, and alcohol.

Participants (Coaches, Parents, Players) WILL NOT

- Exhibit unsportsmanlike conduct.
- Use abusive, obscene, or profane language.
- Engage in verbal or physical threats or abuse aimed at any coach, parent, player, participant, umpire, RMSB Staff, or any other attendee.
- Initiate a fight or scuffle with any coach, parent, player, participant, umpire, RMSB Staff, or any other attendee.
- Cheer against the opposing team.

Rights of RMSB

- RMSB reserves the right to eject any offender from the park or to suspend the offender from future RMSB games who violates any provision of the RMSB Code of Conduct. This is solely to the discretion of RMSB Staff.
- RMSB reserves the right to conduct a background check on any coaches as RMSB deems necessary.

By submitting my team's registration for the Tournament or League, I agree:

- I, as the head coach, (including assistant coaches) will agree to a background check upon the request of RMSB.
- My team (parents included) and I will report unaddressed violations of the RMSB Code of Conduct to RMSB Staff.
- I, as the head coach, am responsible to ensure the above Code of Conduct will be followed by myself, assistant coaches, players, parents, and any other guests.
